Our Mission:

AYSP is a dynamic team of optimistic, compassionate professionals and volunteers dedicated to helping children, youth and families manage mental health and/or justice issues, realize their potential and contribute to their communities.

2022-2023

2022-2023 was the third consecutive year impacted by the COVID-19 global pandemic. The experiences of the previous two years and the increased management of COVID-19 reduced its sway over operations as the year progressed. The hybrid services introduced for most programs in the 2021-2022 year remained in place throughout 2022-2023, with a trend toward more in-person client meetings and a return to in-person groups for some programs and in-person staff meetings. The flexibility to pivot to a virtual meeting in response to bad weather or minor illness is appreciated by staff and clients.

After many months of preparation, AYSP hosted a virtual site visit from the Canadian Centre for Accreditation. After a review of 67 mandatory standards and 30 leading practice standards accross Organizational, Child and Youth Mental Health and Youth Justice categories, AYSP was accredited once again for a four year term. The final report included this quote:

"The organization is commended for its focus on remaining accessible to families and continuing to meet its mission and mandate throughout this unprecedented time."

To continue to support staff in their ongoing work and development, new trainings were introduced in 2022-2023 and included Indigenous Cultural Competency and Aniti-Black Racism training. These have been added to existing new staff training, which already includes Anti Oppressive Practice, 2SLGBTQ+, Crisis De-escalation and Trauma-Informed instruction.

Clients Served in Over 20 Programs by a dedicated team of staff and volunteers.

Children's Mental Health Services = 883 Clients served decreased in 2022-2023 due to staff vacancies including recruitment and retention challenges.

Youth Justice Services = 1032

The number of youth justice clients increased year over year in 2022-2023 due to the return of more in-person services in the community.

Our Vision:

As a pivotal leader and system partner, AYSP is committed to improving the lives of children, youth and families dealing with mental health and/or justice issues within an equity-based framework

The AYSP Fundraising Committee was formed in the 2022-2023 fiscal year. They undertook several initiatives including requests for community donations, an in-house raffle, selling popsicles to staff, snack stations and a bake sale.

These efforts resulted in the purchase of 60+ backpacks filled with school supplies for our clients along with over \$400 of support for the winter care packages assembled by AYSP's youth at risk programs.


